Grant Lee Scholarship Application

Description

The scholarship is named in honor of Dr. Grant S. Lee, Professor of Philosophy at Colorado State University. Dr. Lee served the University with distinction from 1967 until 2006. His teaching and scholarship have contributed substantially to the quality of the academic stature of the institution. His honesty, integrity, hard work, and commitment to the greater good have upheld the highest standards of Colorado State University, enhancing the University's environment for students from all backgrounds, cultures, and racial and ethnic heritages.

Dr. Lee served as Chair of the Minority Faculty and Staff Advisory Committee and was instrumental in strengthening relationships among and between all faculty, staff, students, and alumni. Of particular importance are Dr. Lee's extraordinary efforts to establish and strengthen ties with students and alumni from the Republic of Korea. Dr. Lee has demonstrated outstanding character in his personal and professional endeavors so that for decades Korean students have considered him to be a respected professor, advisor, mentor, role model, father figure, and friend.

The purpose of the scholarship is to benefit international students, with priority consideration given to students from the Republic of Korea.

Selection Criteria

A: The recipients shall:

1. Be an international student enrolled at Colorado State University as an undergraduate or graduate student;
2. Be an undergraduate or graduate student in good academic standing; and
3. Demonstrate leadership and a commitment to service.

B: Priority consideration will be given to students from the Republic of Korea.

Application Procedure

Applications or nominations must be received by no later than March 8, 2012 at the Office of International Programs, Attention Grant S. Lee Scholarship Committee, Laurel Hall, 1024 Campus Delivery. Complete applications must include all of the information requested below. Recipients will be notified in April 2012.

Please provide the following information and submit it with your essay.

1. Name and CSU ID

3. Country of Citizenship
4. Class level as of Spring 2012 (e.g. Sophomore or Masters)
5. Major
6. Anticipated graduation term
7. Do you intend to enroll full-time next semester?
8. Mailing Address
9. Unofficial Transcript
10. Personal essay

The personal essay should include all of the following:

- List leadership experiences in student organizations and co-curricular activities during college. This should include volunteer/university/community activities and professional organizations, as well as participation in any academic extracurricular activities such as research, academic conferences, etc. Please note the emphasis on leadership and service in the scholarship criteria.
- List awards, honors, and scholarships you have received during high school or college. Provide the name of each award, honor, and/or scholarship and the year(s) received.
- Describe your employment history and positions held, especially those jobs that have influenced your career, academic, or personal development.
- What are your long-term career goals? What has motivated you to choose these specific goals? Why do you feel that the course of study you have chosen at Colorado State University is the most appropriate to help you in achieving your goals?
- What else would you like us to know about you? – Optional
